Telecollaborative Task-based Exchange (Virtual Mobility)

Telecollaborative Task-based Exchange (TTE) is an 8-week course which aims to make international working teams of student teachers complete a sequence of telecollaborative tasks in one or more language(s) they can all use. Telecollaboration, also commonly known as virtual exchange, engages student teachers in task-based interaction and collaborative exchange with fellow trainees in geographically distant locations through online communication technologies. This course is offered to all 4EU+ Alliance partners as part of the ENTENTE21 project, EducatioN for The EuropeaN Teacher of the 21st century. It is also open to all INSPE de Paris international partners.

Course Content

International teams of student teachers will work online at their own pace, take part in 4 online sessions with instructors (at week 1, week 3, week 6 and week 8) and write a final reflective essay/or record a multimedia oral presentation about what they got out of the experience.

The task sequence will consist of 3 collaborative tasks which will progressively increase in intensity and degree of collaboration as the exchange progresses: from a basic "getting to know you task" in weeks 1-2, to a more elaborate co-creation task in weeks 6-8 in which international teams will have co collaboratively design a lesson, project or task that could be implemented in their local classrooms.

The course hub will be Sorbonne University's School of Education's Moodle platform (https://moodle2024.inspe-paris.fr/) where participants will be able to find all information, instructions and communication tools about the course.

Learning Outcome

Participating students will be able to

- take into consideration other people's beliefs, values, traditions and worldviews
- express curiosity about other beliefs and other cultural orientations and affiliations
- describe their own cultural affiliations
- reflect critically on their perspectives of the world
- analyse different points of view, products or practices found in other cultures
- build positive relationships with other people in a group
- participate effectively in group meetings
- · work respectfully with other individuals who have cultural affiliations that differ from
- work to build consensus to achieve group goals
- collaborate and co-produce teaching materials/tasks with people from other places in the world.
